 - a. Create an account for mastering biology
 - b. Create an account for the College Board AP Biology if you have not already
- 2. Make out a schedule for summer work and submit it to Mr. Bauersfeld via email by July 10th.
- 3. Read "Make it stick the science of successful learning" by Peter C. Brown there will be a quiz.
 - a. Be sure to access the prompts for the book in your one note notebook (they will also be attached).
 - b. Pay special attention to pages 225-230 you will hear it again
- 4. Write a letter of introduction to Mr. Bauersfeld and email it to him by July 10th.
 - a. This is a formal communication to me and is intended to be practice for communicating with a professor in the future. Therefore, it should:
 - i. have a formal greeting (Hello Mr. Bauersfeld, etc.)
