The 2022-2023 school year came to a close at the end of May, and we are so proud of our students and all their accomplishments. We certainly had a very successful school year, and we are excited for the future of Fenwick. Thank you for your continued support. You are helping to transform the lives of our students!

Fenwick students thrive in our Christ-centered culture of mentorship, collaboration, and vigorous, engaged learning. All students have an opportunity to develop their interests, talents, and abilities outside the classroom, on the stage, in a sport, through service activities, and through a variety of clubs and events. One huge success from last school year was the revamped Flock Block program, which offers more opportunities to our students. Flock Block is a daily 40-minute program where students can meet with teachers or counselors, complete independent study work, and try new activities of their choosing. As part of the Flock Block expansion, we introduced Faith Flock, which is devoted to the faith formation of our students and staff. Students can choose the faith activity in which they want to participate, including outreach projects like making cards or writing letters for children in hospitals, nursing home residents, military personnel, and the incarcerated; making rosaries; making lunches for those in need; prayer ministry; and scripture study.

In March, we were thrilled to receive an extremely generous gift of \$2,000,000 from Chester and Stephanie Yeager to replace our existing grass field with a new synthetic turf field and construct "Falcons Landing," a new multi-use outdoor space located just outside the cafeteria. Our new football field will be ready to host the Homecoming game on October 6 and will mark the first completed project in our campus improvement plan. These transformational gifts are changing the lives of our students and moving Fenwick forward.

Our proud alumni continue to share their love of Fenwick and the feeling is mutual! Last October, we inducted six new members into the Fenwick Athletic Hall of Fame—Ally Beck Ramminger '11, Travis Beuerlein '93, Brooke Gallagher Westerman '91, Chris Laber '72, Dan Muraski '85, and Mary Turvy Hudepohl '10. This October, we will welcome new members into the Fenwick Hall of Achievement.

We are excited to announce that current parents Bob and Jen Westerfield have agreed to serve as chairs for this year's annual Crimson and Gold Campaign and the Dupps Company Charitable Foundation has offered a \$100,000 Day of Giving match. The theme for this year's campaign, which began on July 1, the start of our fiscal year, is "All for One." Our annual Day of Giving will be held on Tuesday, November 7. Any donation made on or before November 7 will count towards the match.

As we look back on the past year, we are proud of all we have accomplished and you can see some highlights from last school year on the back. We are very much looking forward to the future.
