









About Bishop Fenwick High School

Bishop Fenwick High School is a vibrant, Catholic community of faith, learning, and service that enables students of all cultures and abilities to reach their full potential and future success. Fenwick is a co-educational high school conveniently located just off Interstate 75 on State Route 122 in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati with a current enrollment of 451 students.

Fenwick was founded in 1952 and takes its name from Bishop Edward D. Fenwick, the first bishop of Cincinnati. Throughout the years, Fenwick has grown in both size and reputation, and has moved twice from its original campus to accommodate that growth. Fenwick's first home was Old South School, which was built in 1872. The historic building was renovated by the faculty, parishioners, and prospective students before the school was opened. Ten years later, Fenwick moved to a new location on Manchester Road on eighteen acres of land. As the growth of the school continued, and through the generous donation of 66 acres of land from the Akers family and a large outpouring of donations from many families and businesses, Fenwick moved to the current campus on State Route 122 to begin school in the fall of 2004.

Fenwick offers a wide range of Advanced Placement and College Credit Placement courses and a very successful intervention program. Fenwick's unique Flock Block program, a daily 40-minute block period, is designed to give students opportunities to connect with teachers, counselors, peers, and God through different activities, both structured and free-formed. Fenwick is more than just four years of challenging classes, diverse activities, competitive sports, creative arts, and close friendships; Fenwick students are inspired to learn, to lead, and to love.

Fenwick provides a variety of opportunities for students outside the academic classroom, both during Flock Block and after school. Fenwick offers close to 30 different activities for students, both academic and non-academic, ranging from performing arts to robotics to student council. In addition, Fenwick offers more than 20 sports programs as a member of the Greater Catholic Athletic League Co-Ed, and 79% of our students participated in at least one sport in 2023-2024. Over the years, Fenwick teams have won 13 state championships.

Over the past four years, Fenwick students have matriculated to over 280 different colleges/universities. The Class of 2023 matriculated to 36 different colleges/universities, including the United States Coast Guard Academy, Purdue University, Clemson University, and the many great colleges/universities here in Ohio. 96% of the Class of 2023 entered post-secondary education. 78% of the Class of 2023 received scholarship totaling \$17.5M in scholarship offers.
